Since Michael began supporting the Anne Frank Trust UK in 2022, we've expanded our vital work with young people in the North West.

Importantly, the support from the MJ Ball has enabled the Trust to recruit a permanent member of staff to cover the North West and as a result we have reached **11 more schools** in the North West and Cumbria since 2023.

This means that thanks to Michael's support we reached **1,050 peer educators** and **6,753 young people** were peer educated across the North West and Cumbria in 2024.

Michael's support has been crucial to our annual Youth Conference in Manchester for the past two years. His generosity has kept the conference free for attendees and allowed us to invite exceptional speakers to lead workshops.

As well as this, my mentor (Amber Allcock) and I have planned a presentation for Connor Naismith, a local MP where I live, which is something I would have never dreamed I could do, that I now can.

Your donations have made progress such as mine possible, with the Anne Frank Trust sending mentors such as mine to schools around England to educate pupils about how they can become an Ambassador, and how to challenge prejudice and discrimination even if they unfortunately do not consider a role within the Trust. Anne Frank Trust Annual National Youth Conference 2025

Thanks to Michael's support, we hosted the Anne Frank Trust Youth Conference in Manchester. This event brought together Peer Educators, Ambassadors, and staff from across the UK to challenge antisemitism and all forms of prejudice. Students engaged in workshops, learned from each other's experiences, and created responses to the theme 'A Better Future.' They shared their insights with peers, teachers, and experts, and took their learning back to their schools and communities.

83%

of young people feeling they had developed their teamwork skills through conference.

72%

of young people felt they had developed public speaking skills.

68%

of young people felt they had developed confidence.

42%

of young people increased their confidence in challenging prejudice by one place on the scale pre- and post- conference.

45%

of young people increased their confidence in challenging prejudice by two places on the scale pre- and post- conference.

About the Anne Frank Trust

Learning from Anne Frank and the Holocaust, we **empower young people** aged 9 to 15 to **challenge all forms of prejudice**.

Anne Frank is uniquely powerful as a catalyst for learning and reflection about prejudice. Her experiences as a young Jewish person during the Holocaust provide a powerful insight for young people to learn and reflect on the dangers of antisemitism and all forms of prejudice. Through our programmes, **young people gain the knowledge, motivation and skills to make a real difference**.

We focus on 9- to 15-year-olds because they can relate to Anne, and because this age is crucial to the formation of values and beliefs.

Founded in 1991, we have **30 years of expertise in anti-prejudice education**.

Last year we reached over 125,000 young people through our three strands of education which consists of online education, our schools programme and our Youth Ambassador Programme.
