- **Financial literacy and business skills training for thousands of people**, giving them confidence to manage their finances and build more secure futures
- **Support for families living in rural poverty to purchase livestock**, providing both income and vital nutrition for their children

## **Nazia's Story.**

My name is Nazia and I do soap making. I came to Accra, Ghana from the north of the country when I was 19 and began working as a kayayei (head porter).

I loved the Opportunity International training programme. I was so happy not to be carrying heavy loads. I used to get terrible pain in my chest from the weight. I was so happy not to be working in the market, and learning a new skill.

I chose [to train in] soap making because it seemed like the best business opportunity that would make the most money. Soap is a very popular product. Opportunity has recently provided me training in marketing too, so not only can I produce the soap products well but I can also make the packaging attractive to buyers and increase sales. I used to put the liquid soap in plastic water bottles but I



have learnt the value of investing in proper packaging and labelling. My products look really nice.



I recently took out my first loan of 6000 GHS (approx. £400) which I have to pay off over six months. The loan gives me a sense of responsibility and motivates me to work harder. Even on the days when I don't really want to work, I know I have to in order to make the money to pay back the loan.

I am proud to say that since completing the programme, I have trained two other women in soap making. I never want another woman to feel the stress I felt when I was working as a kayayei, which is why I want to help them leave that work and find something better. I'm so grateful to Opportunity for giving me the life I have today.

## Our impact.

In 2024, Opportunity International's work helped transform the futures of young people around the world. **57,300 more children were able to attend school**, giving them the chance to learn, grow and thrive. Thousands of people gained the skills, confidence and financial stability needed to build brighter futures: of the **89,612 clients who received training, 75% were youth** and **77% were women and girls**.

**34,013 clients accessed secure savings**, helping families better support their children's education and wellbeing. Altogether, **61,301 jobs were created or sustained**, strengthening local economies and giving young people and parents alike the opportunity to build long-term stability.
